The following programs are all funded thanks to generous community philanthropy.

Hospice House

Offers 24/7 care in a peaceful, home-like setting. Available for patients needing support outside of the home, or who have no caregiver or any other place to call home.

Palliative Medicine

Provides expert care for those with serious illness, focusing on symptom relief, comfort, and emotional support while still allowing patients to receive curative treatments.

Compassionate Care Fund

Covers hospice benefits for patients without Medicare, Medicaid, or private insurance, so no one is denied care due to financial hardship. Provides "above and beyond" care, including certain medications, treatments, etc. that support patients but aren't typically covered.

Kids' Grief and Healing

Provides a safe environment for children and teens to process grief and learn they are not alone. The program includes our Journeys Camp, 1:1 support, workshops and in-school counseling opportunities.

Grief and Healing

Offers counseling and support groups for anyone in our community coping with loss, helping individuals and families navigate grief with compassion.

Community Outreach and Engagement

Educates the community on hospice care benefits, end-of-life planning, and overall hospice support through events, workshops, health fairs and community engagement opportunities.

Death Doula Program

Provides trained volunteers who offer non-medical, emotional and practical support to patients and/or family members.

Supportive Music

Offers personalized live music led by trained professionals helps ease pain, anxiety, and stress, while bringing comfort to patients and their families.

Companion Pets

Supplies lifelike robotic pets offering comfort and companionship to patients, especially those with dementia or experiencing loneliness.

The Serenity Fund

Assists with urgent needs like utilities, home supplies, or funeral costs for patients, easing burdens so families can focus on time together.

Veterans' Services

Honors veterans with specialized end-of-life care, recognition ceremonies, and support tailored to their unique needs.

Education

Supports HOP staff with scholarships and professional development opportunities, allowing them to deliver expert, compassionate care to those we serve.
